



# What are the issues you face when you are trying to find new players?

#### Transfers (2 ♦/♥)

Die Antworten 2 Karo und 2 Coeur beschreiben die Hand des Antwortenden anstatt den Eröffner nach seiner Hand zu fragen. Der Antwortende reizt 2K mit einem 5er Coeur bzw. 2 Coeur mit einem 5er Pik. Die Idee hinter diesem Verfahren ist, dass der Antwortende viel mehr über die Hand des Eröffners weiß als anders herum, somit hat der Antwortende viel Platz seine Hand zu beschreiben und der Eröffner muss keine Entscheidung treffen. Weil wir, falls wir eine 5er Oberfarbe haben schon wissen, dass wir 7 gemeinsame Karten in dieser Farbe haben, können wir sogar schon ab 0 Punkten transferieren.


